From the Artistic Director:

Yes, we have a new name and mission! After 16 years of faithfully serving both boys and girls, we have made an intentional decision to be an all girls' organization. Typically, a much greater percentage of girls than boys audition for this type of a choral group, and we have worked hard to include both boys and girls for the past 16 years. Also, we felt like it was time for an overall change in our organization, and to redirect our focus. Our singers and parents are very excited about this change as we break new ground and move forward into the future.



Most of our organizational structure will stay the same, with three levels to serve different ages and stages. The Chorale has changed its name to Lyrica, and we have established a "sister chorus" relationship with the Salem Academy Chorus. Director Joy Rushton was thrilled with our invitation to connect in this way, and we are in the process of developing ways to interact and empower girls and young women through singing together. In early October we combined our older singers with high school singers from the Capital City Girl Choir in Raleigh, and the High Point Young Voices group for our annual Advanced Choir Workshop. 

Amani Invitational Children's Choir Festival

Friday & Saturday, January 22-23, Centenary UMC

The purpose of Amani Invitational Children's Choir Festival (AICCF) is to raise awareness of abandoned orphans in Kenya due to HIV/AIDS and poverty, as supported and served by the Amani Children's Foundation based here in Winston-Salem. Children "sing together in harmony and celebrate our unity."



This bi-annual event is hosted by the Winston-Salem Girls Chorus and is partnered with the church's Music and Arts Ministry, which plays a supporting role. Invited children's choirs from Winston-Salem and the Piedmont are included. This will be our third festival, and Betsy Bevan is returning to lead the drumming portion of the event.

The final performance will include our festival theme song, "Beyond Borders", composed by Tom Shelton, together with the first Amani Festival children's group. This song is now in print with GIA publications including festival information. A Love Offering will be collected during the performance which will go to support a baby at one of Kenya's New Life Homes, sponsored by Amani.
