We were one of 16 Women's Choirs included in this project, conducted by Dr. Nana Wolfe-Hill from Wingate University.

"Appalachian Love Songs: Women's Reflections of Love, Loss, and Strength" was composed by Linda Tutas Hougan from Minnesota, who was present during the event. The final concert included a massed choir of 125 singer representatives from the commissioning choirs.
