Melissa Malvar is Director of Admissions and Recruitment at the American Boychoir School, where she conducts the community after-school boychoir program. She is in her ninth year as Associate Director of the Princeton Girlchoir, conducting the Semi-Tones and Grace Notes choirs. She is the Founder of the Children Making a Difference benefit concert, which in eight years has raised over \$18,000 for non-profit organizations. She is also an Adjunct Professor at Rider University, supervising their music education student teachers. Melissa and co-writer Jill Friedersdorf have published over twenty songs which have sold over 75,000 copies.



In early March we took our annual "pilgrimage" to the Piedmont Invitational Children's Choir Festival, which was held at Meredith College in Raleigh with the Capital City Girls Choir as our hosts. Six choirs from North Carolina gathered together to sing under the direction of Dr. Bridgett Sweet.

Dr. Sweet, who is the Assistant Professor of Music Education at the University of Illinois in Urbana-Champaign, led these young singers during the twoday event. Songs ranged from Bach to Appalachian Folk Songs, as these young people sang together and interacted with one another during the weekend.

A concert for Parents and Friends was held at the conclusion of the festival. Each individual choir performed, concluding with a thrilling massed choir performance!
