CCCC's second **Amani Invitational Children's Choir Festival (AICCF)** was held on January 31 -February 1st at Centenary UMC. The purpose of AICCF is to raise awareness of abandoned orphans in Kenya due to HIV/AIDS and poverty, as supported and served by the Amani Children's Foundation, based here Winston-Salem. Children and Youth "sing together in harmony and celebrate our unity". We host this bi-annual event together with the Cathedral Choir of Centenary, and Centenary's

Music and Arts Ministries play a supporting role. Participating choirs this year were CCCC, Centenary's Cathedral Choir, Cantamos Hispanic Choir, Gate City Young Singers of Greensboro, and children's choirs from Mount Tabor, Oak Ridge, and Wesley Memorial United Methodist Churches.

Anne Saxon served as the Artistic Director, with Betsy Bevan as the Drumming Leader. The next festival is scheduled for early 2016.
